Through comprehensive assessment, supervision, and treatment services, the Behavioral Health Docket works to:

- Promote public safety
- Reduce jail crowding
- Decrease recidivism
- Provide rehabilitation opportunities for individuals with mental health diagnoses

City of Richmond Circuit Court Behavioral Health Docket

ELIGIBILITY

Participation in the Behavioral Health Docket (BHD) is at the discretion of the Commonwealth Attorney and based on the following criteria:

- Participants must have a **pending** charge in Richmond City Circuit Court
- Participants must have a mental health diagnosis determined by a mental health assessment (conducted by RBHA)
- Participants must present at least a medium criminogenic risk determined by a risk assessment (conducted by the Division of Adult Programs)
- Participants must be safely manageable in the community

SERVICES OFFERED

Based on the clinical assessment and individual need, participants may be referred for the following services:

- Psychiatric Care
- Medication Management
- Substance Use Disorder Treatment residential or outpatient
- Mental Health Case Management
- Individual Therapy
- Peer Recovery Support Groups
- Trauma Therapy Groups
- Assistance with applying for benefits (i.e., SNAP, TANF, SSI/SSDI)
- Assistance with obtaining housing, employment, and other resources

PROGRAM BASICS

- The Behavioral Health Docket (BHD) is a 12 month voluntary program based in Circuit Court at the John Marshall Courthouse
- Cases on the BHD are managed with consideration of the participant's mental health status
- Participants must stipulate that the facts are sufficient for a finding of guilt
- Participants meet regularly with a Pre-trial or Probation Officer to monitor adherence to supervision requirements - including drug and alcohol screenings
- Participants meet regularly with an RBHA Clinician to facilitate participation in mental health and substance use treatment
- Participants will attend court review hearings every 45-60 days - Hearings are scheduled on the 1st and 3rd Friday of the month at 11am

OUTCOMES/DISPOSITIONS

Upon successful completion of all BHD requirements, an individual's charges may be dismissed, nolle prossed, reduced, or jail time can be suspended. This happens during the sentencing phase of the case. The outcome of a case is directly related to:

- Compliance with mental health treatment
- Compliance with substance use treatment (if clinically indicated)
- Maintaining abstinence from drugs and alcohol
- Compliance with probation requirements
